Here's a tip, don't forget to consider costume safety! Sure it's important to look the role and be in the moment but remember that costumes can alter your ability to properly see, walk and communicate while enjoying the big night. So when it comes to your "Goblins" don't overlook this essential element of a safe and happy Halloween...

Safety First!!!

- Buy costumes that are labeled "flame resistant."
- Avoid baggy, billowing skirts and cloaks that might brush against a candle-lit jack-o-lantern or luminary.
- Be cautious when using makeup for face paint. Much of it is not FDA-approved and could trigger allergic reactions.
- Never use decorative contact lenses; they can result in severe eye infections.
- Make sure your kids won't trip over their costumes and avoid accessories like swords and canes that
